Public Hearing To Receive Comments On 2025 Off Sale Intoxicating Liquor License Applications And Approval Of All 2025 Intoxicating Liquor Licenses

PURPOSE/ACTION REQUESTED

Conduct a public hearing to receive comments on 2025 off sale intoxicating liquor license applications and approve all 2025 intoxicating liquor licenses.

SUMMARY

County Ordinance 101 and state law require a public hearing to be held for all off sale intoxicating liquor license applications. Two applicants applied for a 2025 off sale intoxicating liquor license:

- Simman LLC (DBA Castle Rock Bar and Grill) applied for renewal of their on and off sale and Sunday sales intoxicating liquor license, and
- Woody's Liquor Box Inc. applied for renewal of their off sale intoxicating liquor license.

Notice of the public hearing was sent to all interested parties, Castle Rock Township Clerk, Randolph Township Clerk, and published in the County's Official Newspaper.

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 340A403, Dakota County is authorized to issue licenses for off sale and on sale licenses for the sale of 3.2 percent malt liquor within the County, and pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 340A.402, 405, Dakota County is authorized to issue licenses for on sale and off sale intoxicating liquor to qualifying establishments in the unorganized territories of the County. A county may not issue or renew a retail license to sell any alcoholic beverages until the County Board has received a written recommendation from the Sheriff and County Attorney stating that to the best of their knowledge the applicant is eligible to be licensed under Minn. Stat. § 304A.402. The Sheriff and County Attorney certify that as of this date, the following applicants satisfy the liquor license eligibility requirements. The applications have also been approved by the Townships in which they are located. In anticipation of receiving a renewal application from Hidden Greens, Inc, the County's action is contingent upon review by the Sheriff and County Attorney that they satisfy the liquor license eligibility requirements and review by Marshan Township at their meeting on December 17, 2024.

WHEREAS, a public hearing is required for the purpose of receiving comments and informing the public on applications for off sale intoxicating liquor licenses; and

WHEREAS, all interested parties were notified of the date, time and location of the public hearing on the Simman LLC, dba Castle Rock Bar and Grill, On and Off Sale Intoxicating and Sunday Sales license application and the Woody's Liquor Box, Inc., Off Sale Intoxicating license application; and

WHEREAS, on December 3, 2024 at 9:00 a.m., the Dakota County Board of Commissioners conducted a public hearing on the Simman LLC, dba Castle Rock Bar & Grill, and Woody's Liquor Box, Inc. license applications; and

WHEREAS, a county may not issue or renew a retail license to sell any alcoholic beverages until the County Board has received a written certification from the Sheriff and County Attorney that to the best of their knowledge the application is eligible to be license under Minn. Stat. § 340A.402 and Minn. Rules § 7515.0410; and

WHEREAS, the applications have been approved by the Townships of Castle Rock, Douglas, Marshan, Nininger, Randolph and Ravenna; and

WHEREAS, in anticipation of receiving a renewal application from Hidden Greens, Inc, the County's action is contingent upon review by the Sheriff and County Attorney that the liquor license eligibility requirements are satisfied and review by Marshan Township at their meeting on December 17, 2024.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Dakota County Board of Commissioners hereby approves the following 2025 intoxicating liquor licenses and authorizes the Public Services and Revenue Division to issue the licenses upon payment of the fees:

TITLE

Public Hearing To Receive Comments On Eligible Projects For County Transportation Sales And Use Tax Funds

PURPOSE/ACTION REQUESTED

Conduct a public hearing to receive comments on revisions to the list of transportation projects eligible for County Transportation Sales and Use Tax (SUT) funds and approve list of eligible projects for SUT funds.

SUMMARY

To provide a safe and efficient multi-modal transportation system, Dakota County identifies priority transportation projects needed to improve safety and mobility. To provide adequate funding for priority transportation projects, Dakota County enacted a quarter-cent sales tax and \$20 excise tax on new vehicle sales starting October 1, 2017, by Resolution No.17-364 (June 20, 2017). The transportation SUT is authorized by Minn. Stat. § 297A.993 (The Act). The Act requires the County Board to designate the transportation projects that will use the Transportation SUT following a public hearing. The SUT may be used on more than one project and may be dedicated to a new project by resolution after a public hearing (Attachment: Stat. § 297A.993).

The funds generated by the Transportation SUT have been identified to be used for a list of transportation projects, including transportation maintenance facilities, transit, County highways, regional trails, and trunk highways. The proposed list of eligible projects requires an update to represent projected future transportation system needs identified in the 2040 Transportation Plan and included in the Draft 2025-2029 County Manager's Recommended Budget and Capital Improvement Program (CIP). The revised list of projects (Attachment: Draft SUT Project List) includes the following changes:

- Eliminating projects that have since been completed.
- Updating total project cost estimates and descriptions where new information is available.
- Adding county highway and regional trail projects that were identified as priorities in development of the Draft CIP.
- Adding a project to expand the Empire Transportation Maintenance facility.

The Transportation SUT generated approximately \$24 million in 2023. Revenues from the SUT over the next ten years would not be sufficient to fund all projects on the SUT-eligible project list without external funding and cost share from partner agencies.

By Resolution No. 24-529 (October 29, 2024), the County Board scheduled a public hearing for December 3, 2024, to receive comments on the proposed list of eligible projects for the Transportation SUT. The public hearing was advertised in the *Hastings Journal* on November 14, November 21, and November 28, 2024 (Attachment: Public Hearing Notice), with additional information posted on the Dakota County website.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the Dakota County Board of Commissioners conduct the public hearing to receive comments on the revised list of transportation projects eligible for Transportation SUT funds and approve the list of eligible projects after consideration of any public comments received.

EXPLANATION OF FISCAL/FTE IMPACTS

Adopting the proposed updates to the Transportation SUT-eligible project list ensures that the Draft 2025-2029 CIP is consistent with the SUT project list. Not all projects on the SUT-eligible project list are included in the five-year CIP. Projects on the list will be added to future CIPs as project development advances and external funding is secured.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Minn. Stat. § 297A.993 (the Act) authorizes the Dakota County Board to levy up to onehalf of one percent sales and use tax and an excise tax of \$20 per motor vehicle to fund statutorily defined transportation and transit projects; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 17-364 (June 20, 2017), the Dakota County Board enacted a quartercent sales tax and \$20 excise tax on new vehicle sales starting October 1, 2017, to fund identified transitway, transit expansion, regional County highway, trail, and trunk highway transportation projects; and

WHEREAS, Dakota County has identified a proposed updated list of transportation projects eligible for Transportation Sales and Use Tax funds based on the needs identified in the Draft 2040 Transportation Plan and through the development of the 2025-2029 Draft Capital Improvement Program; and

WHEREAS, the Act allows the County Board to dedicate the proceeds of the Transportation Sales and Use Tax to a new enumerated project by resolution after a public hearing; and

WHEREAS, the County Board held a public hearing on the date hereof following the publication of notice as required by the Act.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Dakota County Board of Commissioners dedicates the proceeds of the Dakota County Transportation Sales and Use Tax to the following projects:

297A.993 COUNTY TRANSPORTATION SALES AND USE TAX.

Subdivision 1. **Authorization; rates.** Notwithstanding section 297A.99, subdivisions 1, 2, 3, 5, and 13, or 477A.016, or any other law, the board of a county, or more than one county acting under a joint powers agreement, may by resolution of the county board, or each of the county boards, following a public hearing impose (1) a transportation sales tax at a rate of up to one-half of one percent on retail sales and uses taxable under this chapter, and (2) an excise tax of \$20 per motor vehicle, as defined in section 297B.01, subdivision 11, purchased or acquired from any person engaged in the business of selling motor vehicles at retail, occurring within the jurisdiction of the taxing authority.

- Subd. 2. **Allocation; termination.** The proceeds of the taxes must be dedicated exclusively to: (1) payment of the capital cost of a specific transportation project or improvement; (2) payment of the costs, which may include both capital and operating costs, of a specific transit project or improvement; (3) payment of the capital costs of a safe routes to school program under section 174.40; (4) payment of transit operating costs; or (5) payment of the capital cost of constructing buildings and other facilities for maintaining transportation or transit projects or improvements. The transportation or transit project or improvement must be designated by the board of the county, or more than one county acting under a joint powers agreement. Except for taxes for operating costs of a transit project or improvement, or for transit operations, the taxes must terminate when revenues raised are sufficient to finance the project. Nothing in this subdivision prohibits the exclusive dedication of the proceeds of the taxes to payments for more than one project or improvement. After a public hearing a county may, by resolution, dedicate the proceeds of the tax for a new enumerated project.
- Subd. 2a. **Uses reporting.** By February 15 of each even-numbered year, a metropolitan county, as defined in section 473.121, subdivision 4, that imposes the taxes under this section must submit a report to the legislative committees with jurisdiction over transportation policy and finance. At a minimum, the report must include:
 - (1) actual transportation sales tax collections by the county over the previous five calendar years;
- (2) an estimation of the total sales tax revenue that is estimated to be collected by the county in the current year and for the next ten calendar years; and
- (3) for each of the previous five calendar years, the current calendar year, and for the next ten calendar years:
 - (i) the amount of sales tax revenue expended or proposed to be expended for each of the following:
- (A) planning, construction, operation, or maintenance of guideways, as defined in section 473.4485, subdivision 1, paragraph (d);
 - (B) nonguideway transit and active transportation uses;
 - (C) highway uses; and
 - (D) uses not otherwise specified in subitems (A) to (C); and
 - (ii) an estimated balance of unspent or undesignated county sales tax revenue.
- Subd. 3. **Administration, collection, enforcement.** The administration, collection, and enforcement provisions in section 297A.99, subdivisions 4 and 6 to 12, apply to all taxes imposed under this section.

- Subd. 4. **Bonds.** (a) A county may, by resolution, authorize, issue, and sell its bonds, notes, or other obligations for the purposes specified in subdivision 2. The county may also, by resolution, issue bonds to refund the bonds issued pursuant to this subdivision.
- (b) The bonds may be limited obligations, payable solely from or secured by taxes levied under this section, and the county may also pledge its full faith, credit, and taxing power as additional security for the bonds. A regional railroad authority within the county may also pledge its taxing powers as additional security for the bonds.
- (c) A county may issue and sell bonds in one or more series and without an election. The county may determine how the bonds shall be secured; how the bonds will bear interest, and the rate or rates, or variable rate; the rank or priority; how the bonds will be executed and be payable, and how they will mature; and how the bonds will be subject to any defaults, redemptions, repurchases, tender options, or other terms. The county may also determine how the bonds shall be sold.
- (d) The county may enter into and perform all contracts deemed necessary or desirable by it to issue and secure the bonds, including an indenture of trust with a trustee located within or outside of the state.
- (e) Before issuing bonds qualifying under this section, the county must publish a notice of its intention to issue the bonds and the date and time of a hearing to obtain public comment on the matter. The notice must be published in the official newspaper of the county or in a newspaper of general circulation in the county. The notice must be published at least 14, but not more than 28, days before the date of the hearing.
- (f) Any project financed with bonds issued under this section must be included in a capital improvement plan as defined in section 373.40, subdivision 3. For purposes of this paragraph, "project" means any project described in subdivision 2, notwithstanding section 373.40, subdivision 1, paragraph (b).
- (g) Except as otherwise provided in this subdivision, the bonds must be issued and sold in the manner provided under chapter 475.

Dakota County Transportation Sales and Use Tax

The Dakota County Transportation Sales and Use Tax (Sales and Use Tax) fund provides investments in regional and multi-modal transportation projects as part of the broader county transportation system. The funds are collected through a quarter-cent sales tax and \$20 excise tax on new vehicle sales authorized under Minn. Stat. §297A.993. The Sales and Use Tax was enacted by the Dakota County Board of Commissioners on October 1, 2017.

Dakota County designated the use of the Sales and Use Tax for regional multi-modal transportation projects. These types of projects have been defined by the County as those that meet the following criteria:

- Regional transitway capital and operating costs
- County Highway projects
 - Principal Arterials
 - Highways with greater than one-half mile access spacing
 - o 10-ton highway replacement and modernization and expansion projects
 - 4-lane County Highways on new alignment
 - County State Aid Highways
 - County Roadways
- Trunk Highway projects
- Transit service expansion capital and operating costs
- Regional trail and greenway projects
- Capital cost of constructing buildings for maintaining transportation/transit projects or improvements

PURPOSE/ACTION REQUESTED

Conduct a public hearing to receive comments regarding the County Manager's Recommended 2025 -2029 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Budget.

SUMMARY

The Dakota County CIP forecasts priorities and budgets for the capital needs of the County for the next five years. The CIP document is a planning tool, but expenditures presented in the first year will be consistent with the County's 2025 Adopted CIP Budget.

By Resolution No. 24-480 (September 24, 2024), the County Board authorized staff to submit the draft CIP to cities and townships for comments. Dakota County sent a letter to the cities and townships requesting their comments by November 15, 2024. Comments on those letters are included in Attachment: 2025-2029 CIP Comments and Responses Summary. In addition, the County Board reviewed the draft 2025-2029 CIP on November 19, 2024, at the Physical Development Committee Meeting.

Minn. Stat. § 373.40, subd. 3, requires the County to conduct a public hearing prior to the adoption of the County Manager's Recommended CIP. The CIP Public Hearing was scheduled by Resolution No. 23-497 (October 24, 2023) and was advertised on November 14 and November 21, 2024, in the Hastings Journal and the County's Website.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the County Board conduct the public hearing and receive comments regarding the 2025-2029 County Manager's Recommended CIP Budget.

EXPLANATION OF FISCAL/FTE IMPACTS

The 2025 County Manager's Recommended Budget will establish authority for the first year of the proposed 2025-2029 CIP Budget. The 2025 County Manager's Recommended CIP Budget totals \$156,016,863 (including Regional Rail Authority), and the five-year total is \$815,654,796.

Manager Welsch,

Thank you for the opportunity to review the County's Draft 2025-29 CIP. We appreciate the partnership and vision of the County with recent projects in West St. Paul as well as upcoming projects.

In review of the plan, we only have concerns and comments related to the plans for Thompson County Park. As you are likely aware, the City and County jointly contributed toward the cost of construction of the Dakota Lodge in 2001. As a part of that agreement, the City has usage rights to the senior center spaces in the Dakota Lodge for 30 years from the date that construction was completed – approximately 2033.

While the City is not fundamentally opposed to improvement or expansion of the Dakota Lodge or Thompson County Park in general, we offer the following comments:

- The City is concerned that the intention of the County to seek state bond funding for this project may undermine the City of West St. Paul's efforts to obtain state bond funding for other projects that have a much greater priority for the City. If the Legislature views this project as a benefit to the City of West St. Paul, and in their judgement decides to fund the Thompson County Park project over other needs of the City, it will have a significant detrimental effect on the City.
- While no official request was ever received, we believe there was a presumption that the City would make a financial contribution to this project. As currently planned, this project would not rise to a level of priority given our financial constraints to make any meaningful contribution in the time frame suggested by the CIP.
- Previous efforts to plan for improvement to the Dakota Lodge did not appear to take in to account the City's right to use the Activity Center portion of the facility for the full period of the existing agreement. Due to the phasing of construction as we understood it, the City and the School District would have had to re-locate our senior services program during the duration of construction. We were also unsure whether there was consideration for our ongoing usage after construction, at least to the end of the term of our rights for such usage.
- Some of the amenities and improvements in the previous plans were potentially redundant of plans that the City has in place and in progress for similar amenities nearby Thompson County Park. One example is a concept for an ampitheater at Thompson

County Park – the City is already likely to add a similar amenity within about a half mile. We would ask that future planning efforts ensure that planned amenities in Thompson County Park are complimentary of the City's park system as a whole.

- Previous efforts to plan for this project were conducted without constructive input from the City and School District. While County staff have been receptive to our concerns more recently, we ask that any planning going forward include the City in a meaningful manner, especially if the intention of the County is to effectuate improvements prior to 2033.
- We are excited for many of the proposed improvements, particularly the creek daylighting. We appreciate the vision and thoughtfulness of plans, even if project specifics and deeper collaboration still warrant attention.

To the extent that the County intends to make improvements to Dakota Lodge prior to 2033, we suggest a re-set of the planning process, not necessarily going back to a blank slate – but stepping back to understand the priorities, needs and financial capacity of all interested parties.

Additionally, if the County intends to seek financial support from the City for improvements to Dakota Lodge or Thompson County Park, that will require much deeper consultation about how this project may help the City to meet other priority facility needs.

The City of West St. Paul desires to continue our collaborative partnership with Dakota County and hope that you view our comments in this letter as an intention to do so. We appreciate all the County does to offer a wonderful park experience within West St. Paul and applaud the desire for future improvements.

WHEREAS, the County went live with the new system on January 3, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the County has determined a need for additional licenses beyond what was originally estimated; and

WHEREAS, the County has worked with DLT Solutions, LLC to provide an estimate for the new licenses; and

WHEREAS, the County amended the DLT Solutions, LLC contract in February 2024 to a not to exceed amount of \$590,103; and

WHEREAS, upon further review of licenses with DLT Solutions, LLC, the County has determined an additional amendment is needed.

WHEREAS, to promote a safe and efficient transportation system throughout Dakota County, the County is a participant with the City of Burnsville and the Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT) to implement County Project (CP) 32-115 and CP 42-164; and

WHEREAS, MnDOT will be leading construction in 2025-2026 of CP 32-115, the I-35W bridge replacement over County State Aid Highway (CSAH) 32 or Cliff Road, and CP 42-164, improvements to the I-35W interchange with CSAH 42, as parts of the I-35W Burnsville project extending from CSAH 32 (Cliff Road) to I-35E; and

WHEREAS, MnDOT and the City of Burnsville are cooperating with the County on all stages of CP 32-115 and CP 42-164; and

WHEREAS, the MnDOT cost participation policy for trunk highway bridges covers up to 80 percent of a locally preferred functional cost increase, and Dakota County and Burnsville prefer a functional enhancement to the new I-35W bridge span length over CSAH 32 (CP 32-115) resulting in a net estimated local cost for bridge enhancement of \$306,000, plus \$56,100 estimated for multiuse trail improvements, total of \$362,100 to be shared at 85 percent by Dakota County and 15 percent by the City of Burnsville; and

WHEREAS, MnDOT awarded \$3,100,000 to CP 42-164 under the Transportation Economic Development grant program; and

WHEREAS, Dakota County Board Resolutions No. 23-429 (September 26, 2023) and No. 24-312 (June 25, 2024) approved a local cost share of Dakota County funds for 70 percent of the estimated net local construction cost of \$2,305,600 after the grant award to complete construction of CP 42-164, with City of Burnsville funds for 30 percent of that same net local cost, in accordance with adopted County Policy; and

WHEREAS, Dakota County has coordinated other CSAH 42 design elements with MnDOT and the City of Burnsville, which are not part of CP 42-164, including trail replacement and a new signal to the east (at the I-35W northbound entrance ramp) totaling \$491,300, to be subject to three-party cost shares or two-party (MnDOT and County) cost shares based on MnDOT and Dakota County cost participation policies; and

WHEREAS, Dakota County staff is working with MnDOT and City of Burnsville staff to finalize a three-party Cooperative Agreement addressing all details and payment terms for estimated cost participation as described above, with actual costs for project construction to ultimately apply.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Dakota County Board of Commissioners hereby authorizes entering into a cooperative agreement with the Minnesota Department of Transportation and the City of Burnsville to address cost participation for County Project 32-115 and County Project 42-164, with Dakota County costs for County Project 32-115 based on the Minnesota Department of Transportation cost participation policy for trunk highway bridge replacement with locally preferred enhancement, Dakota County and Burnsville costs for County Project 42-164 to be based on project traffic served as in prior agreements (70% County/30% City after grant award), and costs for other County State Aid Highway 42 design elements east of County Project 42-164 to be based on Minnesota Department of Transportation and Dakota County cost participation policies, subject to approval by the County Attorney's Office as to form.

Authorize the Enterprise Finance and Information Services Director to execute a contract with SFM Risk Solutions, Inc. for administration of workers' compensation claims.

SUMMARY

Since 1990, Dakota County has been self-insured for workers' compensation claims and has contracted for administration of claims through a third-party administrator (TPA). Dakota County has utilized the services of SFM Risk Solutions, Inc. (SFM), since October 2013 when our previous long term TPA- RTW, Inc. (RTW) abruptly exited the TPA market.

SFM is the leading workers' compensation insurer in the midwest, serving businesses of all sizes and types in 16 states. Since assuming our business in 2013, SFM has provided quality customer service and management of County employee's workers compensation claims. Staff has found SFM to be responsive to Dakota County's needs. At the County's request, SFM has provided a dedicated claims manager. A dedicated claims manager provides a single point of contact for conducting business and strong communication lines which is especially important in the management of lost time claims.

On September 3, 2024, staff issued a Request for Proposal for Third Party Administration of Workers' Compensation Claims. Two vendors responded to the solicitation and proposals were reviewed and rated by staff based on qualifications, experience of the proposer, services included references, intangibles, and service fees. Two TPA vendors responded to the requests for proposals: SFM and PMA, companies.

SFM provided the most competitive quote for TPA services, maintaining a cost-of-living increase in annual costs. SFM has a close working relationship with several other counties and municipalities in Minnesota and understands the complexities of handling workers' compensation for government entities. Dakota County has been pleased with the services provided by SFM and the claims handling of our larger and more complex workers' compensation claims.

SFM has offered the County a five-year contract from 2025 through 2029. SFM's proposal reflects a 7.12 percent premium increase for 2025 at a cost of \$44,583 and cost increases for each of the next four years. The TPA cost trending attachment reflects annual TPA costs and percent increase from 2020-2030.

SUMMARY

The Dakota County Community Development Agency (CDA) administers three federal entitlement programs on behalf of Dakota County: The Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program, the HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME) program, and the Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) program. Funds for the three federal entitlement programs are provided through HUD through the Treasury Letter of Credit process. Per an annual subrecipient agreement between the CDA and Dakota County, the CDA must prepare a listing of all claims certified and paid for by the CDA for the CDBG, HOME, and ESG programs. The listing must be submitted to the Dakota County Board of Commissioners for ratification on a quarterly basis. In 2020, Dakota County also received special allocations of CDBG and ESG (CDBG-CV and ESG-CV) for activities that prevent, prepare for, and respond to the coronavirus; these expenses are also included for ratification. As of December 2023, the ESG-CV funds are fully expended. In 2021, the Dakota County HOME Consortium received a special allocation of HOME-American Rescue Plan Act (HOME-ARPA) funds. The attachment shows the entitlement and special allocation expenses for July 1, 2024-September 30, 2024.

The CDBG entitlement and special allocation expenses for July 1, 2024-September 30, 2024, totaled \$290,061.33. The HOME entitlement and special allocation expenses for the same period for all HOME Consortium members, including Dakota, suburban Ramsey, Washington, and Anoka counties and the City of Woodbury, totaled \$357,819.58. The ESG entitlement expenses for the same period totaled \$20,742.42. These funds were expended for previously approved projects from Fiscal Years 2019-2024.

RECOMMENDATION

Community Development Agency and County staff recommend the ratification of the guarterly expenditures for the Dakota County CDBG, HOME, and ESG federal entitlement and special allocation programs (total of \$668,623.33) for the period of July 1, 2024-September 30, 2024.

The Consortium includes Anoka, Dakota, suburban Ramsey and Washington counties, and the City of Woodbury. In 2021, the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) awarded the Consortium a special allocation of HOME-ARP funds. These special funds, totaling \$3,253,282 for Dakota County (Consortium total of \$8,762,441), can be used only for four activities: acquisition and development of non-congregate shelter units, development and support of affordable housing, tenant-based rental assistance, and provision of supportive services. These activities must primarily benefit four qualifying populations, including individuals and families who are homeless, at risk of becoming homeless, fleeing or attempting to flee domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, or human trafficking, and other vulnerable populations, including individuals and families with incomes at or below 30 percent Area Median Income.

By Resolution No. 2022-219, the County Board approved the HOME-ARP Plan and authorized its submittal to HUD. HUD approved the HOME-ARP Plan, which for Dakota County allocates the funds to a future non-congregate shelter development, future affordable housing projects at sites to be determined, and grant administration. For the CDA to administer the HOME-ARP Program, the County will need to enter into a subrecipient agreement with the CDA. The CDA has been exploring proposals on which to use the funds and has awarded \$3 million of HOME-ARP funds with contingencies to 360 Communities for a new non-congregate domestic violence shelter.

RECOMMENDATION

Dakota County and CDA staff recommend authorizing the County Board Chair to execute a subrecipient agreement between the County and the CDA for the administration of the HOME-ARP Program.

Approve substantial amendments to the 2021 HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME) Program.

SUMMARY

The Dakota County Community Development Agency (CDA) administers the HOME Program on behalf of Dakota County and the Dakota County HOME Consortium, which includes the counties of Anoka, Dakota, Ramsey, and Washington and the City of Woodbury. The HOME Program requires that 15 percent of a jurisdiction's HOME allocation be used for eligible HOME activities by nonprofit organizations that qualify as Community Housing Development Organizations (CHDO) and the Dakota County HOME Consortium has set aside these funds to be used by certified CHDOs.

There are three types of substantial amendments to the CDBG and HOME Programs permissible by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD): the creation of a new activity or cancellation of an activity, increase or decrease of an activity budget by \$100,000 or more at one time, and change to the location and/or national objective of an activity.

The 2021 HOME CHDO funds for the Dakota County HOME Consortium are currently pooled and budgeted for a CHDO Rental activity. CDA staff has been discussing a potential homeowner project with Rondo Community Land Trust and proposes creating a 2021 CHDO Homeowner activity to allocate funds for this potential project. The CHDO Rental activity's current budget of \$362,653 will be decreased by \$300,000, and the \$300,000 will be reallocated to the newly created CHDO Homeowner activity. Additionally, Anoka County wishes to cancel its 2021 Tenant-Based Rental Assistance activity and reallocate those funds totaling \$18,000 to its 2021 Rental activity.

The CDA Citizen Participation Plan requires public notification of substantial amendments for the HOME Program. A public notice for the substantial amendments described above was placed in the Star Tribune on November 1, 2024, and on the CDA and Dakota County websites. No comments were received.

RECOMMENDATION

Dakota County and CDA staff recommend approval of the substantial amendments to the 2021 Dakota County HOME Consortium Program.

Authorization To Execute Detour Agreement No. 1057869 With Minnesota Department Of Transportation For Trunk Highway 3 In City Of Rosemount

PURPOSE/ACTION REQUESTED

Authorize the execution of Agreement 1057869 with the Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT) to accept reimbursement for State Project 1921-107, a Trunk Highway (TH) 3 detour on Count State Aid Highways 38, 31, and 42.

SUMMARY

To provide a safe and efficient transportation system, the County partners with MnDOT for the use of County Highways as applicable to facilitate traffic operations during TH construction projects. In 2025, MnDOT will be constructing a roundabout at the intersection of TH 3 and 142nd Street West near Rosemount High School. Minn. Stat. § 161.25 authorizes the Commissioner of Transportation to designate any public street or highway as a temporary detour when determined necessary for the construction or maintenance of any TH. MnDOT requires a detour to carry TH 3 traffic on CSAH 38 (McAndrews Road), CSAH 31 (Pilot Knob Road), and CSAH 42 (150th Street West) during construction (Attachment: Detour Map). The detour is expected to be in place for about 12 weeks beginning in the spring. The State will reimburse the County for road life consumed by the detour through the income determined by the "Gas Tax Method" in accordance with the Detour Management Study Final Report. The "Gas Tax Method" uses a formula that multiplies the combined tax factor per mile, Average Daily Traffic count of vehicles diverted from TH 3, the County road detour length, and the duration of the detour to determine the State's cost.

Executing MnDOT Agreement No.1057869 is necessary for reimbursement by the State to the County. This agreement follows MnDOT's standard documents for detours of state highway traffic onto a highway not under MnDOT's jurisdiction.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff Recommends entering into agreement No. 1057869 with MnDOT to accept reimbursement for State Project 1921-107, TH 3 detour on CSAH 38, 31, and 42.

EXPLANATION OF FISCAL/FTE IMPACTS

The State will reimburse the County in the amount of approximately \$39,390 in accordance with MnDOT Agreement No. 1057869 for the road life consumed by the TH 3 Detour through State Project 1921-107. This reimbursement will be applied to the Transportation Capital Improvement Program Fund.



PURPOSE/ACTION REQUESTED

- Authorize an amendment to the 2024 Transportation Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Budget to establish right of way budget for County Project (CP) 42-179 for the 2024 fiscal
- Authorize the execution of a joint powers agreement with the City of Rosemount to establish cost share and responsibilities for CP 42-179 advanced right of way acquisition.
- Authorize entering into a purchase agreement with KJ Walk to acquire Parcel ID 34-64851-02-040, a 1.5-acre commercial property in Rosemount, in advance of CP 42-179.

SUMMARY

To provide a safe and efficient transportation system, Dakota County and the City of Rosemount are planning improvements to the intersection of County State Aid Highway (CSAH) 42 and Biscayne Avenue in Rosemount. The intersection improvement project is the result of ongoing coordination with the City of Rosemount and Independent School District 196 regarding a proposed Rosemount Middle School at the southeast quadrant of CSAH 42 and Biscayne Avenue. County staff has participated in coordination meetings and reviews of the proposed middle school's site plan and traffic impact analysis. The anticipated traffic generation from the proposed middle school and development growth in the area, improvements to the intersection geometry, and addition of a signal were identified. This improvement aligns with the recommendations from the County Highway 42 Management Plan (2022). The County and City coordinated on the project needs during the 2025-2029 CIP development and subsequently included the project with preliminary/final design planned for 2025, right of way acquisition in 2026, and construction occurring in 2027. The school district anticipates a fall 2027 opening.

A geometry improvement to the intersection is necessary to correct sight line and safety issues with the existing skewed intersection that is located directly adjacent to a high-speed horizontal curve. A realignment of Biscayne Avenue (see Attachment: Project Exhibit) is necessary to meet design and safety standards needed for the addition of a traffic signal. This realignment requires right of way acquisition from Parcel ID 34-64851-02-040 in the northwest quadrant. Coordination with Rosemount revealed the parcel in question had received interest from a proposed developer to install a carwash.

A purchase agreement between the proposed development and KJ Walk (property owner) had not been executed yet for the 1.5-acre commercial property. County staff reached out to KJ Walk to determine if the property owner would be agreeable to working with the agencies to acquire right of way for the project. KJ Walk indicated willingness for the County to acquire the entire 1.5-acre parcel from the open market but was not interested in a partial acquisition. To ensure the property does not develop ahead of CP 42-179, resulting in a higher right of way acquisition cost, staff recommends an early acquisition of the entire parcel.

Parcel ID 34-64851-02-040 is currently listed on the open market with an asking price of \$948,710, a \$14.00/SF cost. County Real Estate staff analyzed recent commercial property sales in the area and determined the asking price to be a fair and reasonable cost based on recent sales of similar commercial properties. A comparison table is included below.

In order to proceed with an advanced right of way acquisition, the 2024 Transportation CIP needs to be amended to create project budget for CP 42-179 in 2024. The draft 2025-2029 Transportation CIP has right of way planned in 2026. If the Board authorizes the advanced right of way acquisition, an offer will be presented in 2024 and require the budget to be established. Sufficient funds exist within the Transportation Sales and Use Tax (SUT) account to establish a 2024 budget of \$948,710 for CP 42-179. Planned dollars for right of way acquisition in 2026 will be reduced as a result. If the County Board desires discussion for an alternative offer or negotiation strategy, it can recess to a closed executive session pursuant to Minn. Stat. 13D.05, Subd, 3 (3).

The proposed improvements of CP 42-179 require a cost share from the City of Rosemount based on the County's 2040 Transportation Plan Cost Share Policy. A joint powers agreement between the County and City of Rosemount is necessary to outline cost participation and responsibilities for advanced right of way acquisition.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends authorization for a budget amendment to the 2024 Transportation CIP Budget to establish 2024 right of way acquisition budget for CP 42-179, advanced right of way acquisition of Parcel ID 34-64851-02-040 to preserve necessary right of way for CP 42-179, and a Joint Powers Agreement with Rosemount to establish cost participation and responsibilities.

EXPLANATION OF FISCAL/FTE IMPACTS

The 2024-2028 Transportation CIP does not include budget for CP 42-179. A budget amendment is necessary to proceed with advanced right of way acquisition, and a budget of \$948,710 is recommended. County State Aid Highway 42 Management Improvements are included in the Transportation SUT eligible projects list. Sufficient funds exist within the Transportation SUT account

PURPOSE/ACTION REQUESTED

- Authorize County sponsorship of Snowmobile Club Grant-in-Aid Program (Program) applications from three area snowmobile clubs.
- Authorize execution of agreements related to Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) funding assistance for trail development and maintenance.

SUMMARY

To promote recreational opportunities in Dakota County, the County has historically sponsored three snowmobile clubs: Dakota Trails Association, Inc., Inver Grove Heights Connections Snowmobile Club, and Waterford Warriors Snowmobile Club, Inc. (Clubs). The Clubs are requesting County sponsorship for the 2024-2025 grant year and subsequent years unless the grant program requirements are changed. The County sponsorship is required by the DNR for the Clubs to obtain funding from the DNR. The Clubs have submitted Program applications to the County, as they have done in prior years, for funding of trail development and maintenance for approximately 175 miles of snowmobile trails in Dakota County.

DNR Program

Since 1973, the DNR has administered a grant-in-aid program for the development and maintenance of snowmobile trails, which requires local trail clubs to be sponsored by local units of government to obtain DNR trail maintenance funding.

The DNR will again be using the performance-based Program for the 2024-2025 funding cycle and subsequent years unless the grant program requirements are changed. This Program bases payment of DNR funds upon the sponsor's certification that benchmarks are achieved, including having the trails prepared and ready to be opened, adequate grooming, post-season closure, and the submission of required paperwork. The Program also provides for financial penalties if certified benchmarks are not achieved.

Legal and Risk Management Issues

There are responsibilities and liabilities as a sponsor under the performance-based Program. The assignment agreements between the County and the Clubs shift responsibility and potential liability for performance benchmarks to the Clubs (Attachment: Assignment Agreement). This maintains the

County's historical role as a pass-through agency between the DNR and the Clubs.

RECOMMENDATION

PURPOSE/ACTION REQUESTED

- Delegate authority to the County Manager for the award of a construction contract to the lowest responsive bidder for the Safe Routes to School (SRTS) improvements on County State Aid Highway (CSAH) 28 near Simley High School, County Project (CP) 28-66.
- Authorize executing a joint powers agreement (JPA) with the City of Inver Grove Heights to establish roles, responsibilities, and cost share for the SRTS Improvements on County State Aid Highway (CSAH) 28, CP 28-66

SUMMARY

To provide a safe and efficient transportation system, Dakota County is proceeding with CP 28-66 in Inver Grove Heights that includes pedestrian and bicycle safety, SRTS improvements, and traffic signal improvements along CSAH 28 (80th Street East) between Babcock Avenue and Boyd Avenue in Inver Grove Heights. This project was identified in the 2021 Dakota County Pedestrian Crossing Safety Assessment to provide improved pedestrian and bicyclist crossing infrastructure for community destinations along CSAH 28 in the project area. During project development, the SRTS crossing infrastructure improvements were separated into an independent plan set and construction project to meet funding deadlines in 2024. This request for board action only refers to the SRTS plans of CP 28-66.

A \$250,000 Minnesota State SRTS grant was awarded to Dakota County in 2022 to fund crossing infrastructure improvements along CSAH 28 near Simley High School. To meet the requirements of the grant agreement, a contractor must be awarded the construction contract before the end of 2024. If a grant agreement is not completed, the funds will be withdrawn. Construction is scheduled for 2025.

To facilitate the grant agreement timeline, staff requests delegation of authority to the County Manager to award the construction contract to the lowest responsible bidder for CP 28-66. This would allow the construction advertisement, award, and contract execution to meet the end of 2024 deadline. The Engineer's Estimate for the SRTS work is \$186,157.00, and the award is anticipated to be under the \$250,000 grant fund. If the award to the low bidder requires a budget amendment or if rejection of bids is required, it would be brought to the County Board for action. Advertisement for

construction began November 11; bids will be opened on December 3.

A JPA between the County and the City of Inver Grove Heights is necessary to outline cost participation, preliminary and final design responsibilities, future maintenance responsibility, and construction for CP 28-66. Costs will be shared in accordance with County policy. The County is the lead agency for design and construction phases.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends delegating authority to award the construction contract to the lowest responsible bidder to the County Manager for the SRTS crossing improvements construction portion of CP 28-66.

Staff also recommends authorization to enter a JPA with the City of Inver Grove Heights to formalize cost contributions and responsibilities for design and construction of CP 28-66.

EXPLANATION OF FISCAL/FTE IMPACTS

The adopted 2024 Transportation Capital Improvement Program Budget includes a total budget of \$2,238,058 for the project. This includes \$250,000 in funds from the Minnesota State SRTS grant. The construction cost of the SRTS crossing improvements construction contract is expected to be completely covered by the SRTS grant funds. The engineer's Estimate is \$186,157.00.



SUMMARY

In 2022, the County acquired a 5,787-square-foot property to be used as a youth shelter for up to 12 individuals per night, now referred to as the Aspen House. Community Services staff has again contracted with Nexus Family Healing to manage the operation of the shelter with all of the associated requirements included in that contract. In order to have Nexus Family Healing operate in a County facility, a license agreement for use of that space is necessary per County requirements. Nexus Family Healing will manage all aspects of youth care in addition to most of the day-to-day operations, including maintenance and utilities, with three key items remaining under contract with the County. Specifically, these are property insurance for the facility through Risk Management, the parking lot access agreement with the neighboring church through Facilities Management, and life/safety requirements through Facilities Management.

Facilities Management, Community Services staff, and Nexus Family Healing have agreed to the license terms and fees in the draft license document (Attachment: Draft Nexus Family Healing) License Agreement) summarized below:

January 1, through December 31, 2025 The fee is established as \$5,280 per year or \$440 per month.

January 1, through December 31, 2026 The fee is established as \$5,280 per year or \$440 per month.

RECOMMENDATION

NEXUS FAMILY HEALING LICENSE TO USE COUNTY SPACE

THIS LICENSE AGREEMENT ("License Agreement") is made by and between the County of Dakota, a political subdivision of the State of Minnesota, by and through its Facilities Management Department, 1590 Highway 55, Hastings, Minnesota 55033, hereinafter referred to as "the COUNTY," and Nexus Family Healing, 505 Hwy 169 No., Suite 500, Plymouth, MN 55441, hereinafter referred to as "the OCCUPANT".

WITNESSETH: The COUNTY and the OCCUPANT, in consideration of the license fees, covenants and consideration hereinafter specified, do hereby agree each with the other as follows:

1. LICENSED PREMISES:

The COUNTY grants, and the OCCUPANT accepts, a license to occupy and use the following described premises located in the City of Mendota Heights, County of Dakota, Minnesota, legally described or depicted in the attached ATTACHMENT 1, to wit:

The property containing a building having approximately Five Thousand Seven Hundred Eighty-Seven (5,787) feet of space, together with the surrounding grounds and parking lot, all located at 2031 Victoria Road South, Mendota Heights, MN 55118 and commonly known as "the Dakota County Aspen House"

(the "Licensed Premises").

2. COUNTY WARRANTIES:

The COUNTY represents and warrants that it is solely entitled to all license fees payable under the terms of this License Agreement and that the OCCUPANT shall have the exclusive use of the Licensed Premises during the full term of this License Agreement and any extension or renewal thereof, according to the terms of this License Agreement.

3. TERM:

- 3.1 The term of this license shall be from January 1, 2025, to December 31, 2026.
- 3.2 Notwithstanding anything in Section 3.1, The COUNTY is not required to renew or extend the term of this License Agreement beyond the original term and the COUNTY may, at its sole option and discretion, allow the Agreement to expire at the end of such term or terminate Licensee's use of the Licensed Premises according to the terms of this License Agreement.

4. TERMINATION:

4.1 The COUNTY may terminate this License Agreement in the event of a default by the OCCUPANT upon ten (10) days' notice, if the OCCUPANT does not cure the default within such notice period.

- 4.2 Either party may terminate this License Agreement upon ten (10) days' notice if the services contract between the OCCUPANT and the COUNTY dated _____ for the OCCUPANT's operation of a youth shelter on the Licensed Premises (the "Services Contract") is terminated by either party for any reason under the provisions of the Services Contract. The effective date of the termination of this License Agreement shall coincide with the effective date of the termination of the Services Contract.
- 4.3 This License Agreement may be terminated by either party for convenience by giving the other party ninety (90) days' notice. Such notice shall state the reason for termination.

5. LICENSE FEE:

OCCUPANT shall pay to the COUNTY the following license fees for use of the Licensed Premises, and in consideration of all the covenants, representations, and conditions of this License Agreement and according to the terms hereof:

- 5.1 For the period of January 1, 2025 through December 31, 2025, the sum of Four Hundred Forty and 00/100 Dollars (\$440.00) per month.
- For the period January 1, 2026, through December 31, 2026, the sum of Four Hundred Forty and 00/100 Dollars (\$440.00) per month.
- 6. The COUNTY will provide OCCUPANT with quarterly invoices (sent to nhonexusap@nexusfamilyhealing.org) for license fees and all other payment obligations due under this Agreement according to the following schedule, provided that late submission of a quarterly invoice shall not relieve OCCUPANT of its obligation to pay the invoice:

Q1 (Jan. – Mar.): May 30 Q2 (Apr. – June): August 31 Q3 (July – Sept.) November 30 Q4 (Oct. – Dec.): February 28

OCCUPANT shall pay the invoice in full within thirty (30) days after receipt of the invoice.

- 7. The OCCUPANT covenants that at the termination of this License Agreement by lapse of time or otherwise, it shall remove its personal property and vacate and surrender possession of the Licensed Premises to the COUNTY in as good condition as when the OCCUPANT took possession, ordinary wear and damage by the elements excepted. The Licensed Premises shall be considered vacated only after all areas, including storage areas, are clear of the OCCUPANT's belongings, and keys and other property furnished to the OCCUPANT by the COUNTY have been returned to the COUNTY. Alterations or fixtures installed by the COUNTY attached to the Licensed Premises shall remain a part thereof and shall not be removed by the OCCUPANT without the COUNTY's prior written consent.
- 8. If the Licensed Premises are destroyed or damaged by fire, tornado, flood, civil disorder, or any cause whatsoever, so that the Licensed Premises become untenantable, the license fees shall be abated from the time of such damage and the OCCUPANT shall have the option of terminating this License Agreement, effective immediately upon notice to the COUNTY, or of allowing the COUNTY such amount of time as the OCCUPANT deems reasonable to restore the damaged Licensed Premises to tenantable condition.

9. The COUNTY shall be responsible for the payment of all real estate taxes and special assessments levied on the Licensed Premises.

10. DUTIES OF THE COUNTY:

- 9.1 The COUNTY shall, at its expense, provide adequate electrical outlets upon the Licensed Premises for normal office and residential uses.
- 9.2 The COUNTY shall, at its expense, provide the Licensed Premises with heating, cooling, and ventilation facilities of a design capacity sufficient to maintain the Licensed Premises at a comfortable temperature for normal office and residential uses under all but the most extreme weather conditions.
- 9.3 The COUNTY shall, at its expense, provide and manage the periodic inspections and testing of fire extinguishers, fire sprinkler systems, and kitchen hoods in the Licensed Premises.
- 9.4 The COUNTY shall, at its expense, provide and manage the long-term maintenance of the parking areas of the Licensed Premises, including striping and bituminous management, any necessary repairs or replacement the roof or structural components of the building, and any necessary replacement of the HVAC system of the Licensed Premises if regular maintenance and repairs duties assigned to the OCCUPANT hereunder cannot keep the HVAC system in proper operating condition as required in this License Agreement.
- 9.5 The COUNTY shall coordinate with the OCCUPANT to schedule and conduct the quarterly inspection of building conditions and operations to ensure the building maintenance managed by the OCCUPANT is satisfactorily completed and any issues are being addressed in a timely manner. A list of maintenance activities is attached as ATTACHMENT 2 which will be reviewed and by the parties from time to time and amended as agreed upon in writing.

11. DUTIES OF THE OCCUPANT:

- 10.1 The OCCUPANT shall allow access to the Licensed Premises by COUNTY or its authorized representatives, at any reasonable time upon reasonable notice during the life of this License Agreement, for any purpose within the scope of this License Agreement.
- 10.2 The OCCUPANT shall not use the premises at any time for any purpose forbidden by law.
- 10.3 The OCCUPANT acknowledges that this License Agreement does not convey any interest in the Licensed Premises to OCCUPANT and OCCUPANT may not assign or otherwise transfer OCCUPANT's interest in this License Agreement without the prior written consent of COUNTY.
- 10.4 The OCCUPANT shall endeavor to keep the public sidewalks adjacent to the building and any sidewalks or stairways leading from the public sidewalks to the building free from snow, ice, and debris, including the parking lot.

- 10.5 The OCCUPANT shall provide the premises with overhead lighting to provide sufficient foot candle power throughout the space.
- 10.6 The OCCUPANT shall provide, at its own expense, sufficient light, heat, and maintenance to the buildings, structures and grounds, and public access to the Licensed Premises, so that such areas shall be safe and reasonably comfortable.
- 10.7 The OCCUPANT shall provide the premises with a means or system of waste or trash disposal.
- 10.8 The OCCUPANT shall manage the maintenance and repairs as necessary for the kitchen hood system.
- 10.9 OCCUPANT shall manage all lawn, landscaping, and exterior grounds maintenance.
- 10.10 The COUNTY and the OCCUPANT agree to periodic (quarterly or as otherwise reasonably requested by the COUNTY) building condition and operational inspections to be coordinated between both parties to ensure the building maintenance managed by the OCCUPANT is satisfactorily completed and any issues are addressed in a timely manner. A list of the OCCUPANT's maintenance activities is attached as ATTACHMENT 2, which list shall be reviewed by the parties from time to time and amended as the parties may agree.

12. INSURANCE:

- 11.1 Property Damage. It shall be the duty of the COUNTY and the OCCUPANT to maintain insurance or self-insurance on their own property, both real and personal. Notwithstanding anything apparently to the contrary in this License Agreement, the COUNTY and the OCCUPANT hereby release one another and their respective partners, officers, employees and property managers from any and all liability or responsibility to the other or anyone claiming through or under them by way of subrogation or otherwise for loss or damage to property, even if such loss or damage shall have been caused by the fault or negligence of the other party, or anyone for whom such party may be responsible.
- 11.2 Liability. The COUNTY and the OCCUPANT agree that each party will be responsible for its own acts and the results thereof to the extent authorized by law and shall not be responsible for the acts of any others and the results thereof. The OCCUPANT agrees to acquire and maintain, at its sole expense, during the term of this License Agreement and any extension thereof, commercial general liability insurance with a limit of coverage equal to or greater than the liability limits under Minn. Stat. Ch.466. The COUNTY'S liability shall be governed by the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Section 466.04. The COUNTY agrees to acquire and maintain, at its sole expense, commercial general liability insurance (or comparable coverage under a program of self-insurance), with a limit of coverage equal to or greater than the liability limits under Minnesota Statutes Chapter 466.
- 11.3 Workers' Compensation. The COUNTY and the OCCUPANT shall be responsible for injuries to or death of their respective employees and shall maintain workers' compensation coverage or self-insurance coverage for its respective personnel.

13. MAINTENANCE AND REPAIRS:

- 12.1 The OCCUPANT shall, at its own expense, maintain all plumbing, wiring, heating and cooling devices, and ductwork, located on the Licensed Premises in proper working condition during the term of this License Agreement.
- 12.2 The OCCUPANT shall, at its own expense, make such necessary repairs to the plumbing, wiring, heating and cooling devices, and ductwork, located on the Licensed Premises, so as to continue to provide all such service as required by this License Agreement. The COUNTY shall not be responsible for repairs upon implements or articles which are the personal property of OCCUPANT, nor shall the COUNTY bear the expense of repairs to the Licensed Premises necessitated by damage caused by the OCCUPANT beyond normal wear and tear for a shelter facility.

14. JANITORIAL SERVICE:

The OCCUPANT shall, at its own expense, provide janitorial services and supplies for cleaning of the Licensed Premises, trash removal, and replacement of fluorescent bulbs, starters and ballasts, as needed.

15. UTILITIES:

The OCCUPANT shall bear the cost of heat, electricity, air conditioning, sewer, and water services to the Licensed Premises.

- 16. The OCCUPANT agrees that in exercising its management responsibilities of the Licensed Premises, including, in particular, the maintenance, repair, alterations and construction relating thereto, it shall fully comply with all applicable laws, rules, ordinances and regulations as issued by any political subdivision having jurisdiction and authority in connection with said property.
- 17. The OCCUPANT shall observe reasonable precautions to prevent waste of heat, electricity, water, air-conditioning or any other utility or service.

PURPOSE/ACTION REQUESTED

Approve right of way acquisition for permanent and temporary construction easements for County Project (CP) P00147.

SUMMARY

To provide a safe and efficient greenway transportation system, Dakota County is proceeding with the Veterans Memorial Greenway Project (Attachment: Project Location Map). Veterans Memorial Greenway, Phase II, will entail the construction of about two miles of shared-use trail in Eagan and Inver Grove Heights, including a bridge over State Trunk Highway 3. Construction is proposed in 2025. Phase II is being funded in part by Federal allocated funding. The Federal funding associated with CP P00147, Phase II, requires the timely acquisition of necessary right of way.

Dakota County is leading the design, construction, and right of way acquisition for CP P00147, Phase II. Acquisition of right of way in the form of permanent and temporary construction easements from four parcels is recommended to proceed with CP P00147. Permanent easements are necessary for the trail alignment, and temporary construction easements are necessary for multiuse trail construction for grading and restoration associated with trail grading and retaining wall installation to mitigate steep slopes. All permanent trail and retaining wall improvements will be located within County easements. Patchin Messner Appraisals, Inc. has completed the appraisals with a total appraised value of \$198,100. Appraisal data has been provided to the County Board in a separate, confidential spreadsheet, as the appraisals are confidential, non-public data pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 13.44. subd. 3.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends approval of right of way acquisition for the right of way necessary for CP P00147.

EXPLANATION OF FISCAL/FTE IMPACTS

Currently, there are available Acquisition Opportunity Fund (AOF) and County AOF matching funds in the approved 2024 Parks Capital Improvement Program budget for this acquisition. If AOF funds are not available, Environmental Legacy Funds (ELF) are available for this acquisition. There is currently \$10,245,962 allocated ELF within the Parks Capital Improvement Program. Sufficient funds are available for the right of way necessary for CP P00147.



Authorize acceptance of a donated 37,855 square-foot regional greenway trail easement (Easement) from the City of Eagan (City) for a segment of the Veterans Memorial Greenway in the cities of Eagan and Inver Grove Heights.

SUMMARY

To provide a safe and efficient greenway transportation system, Dakota County is proceeding with the Veterans Memorial Greenway Project (Attachment: Project Location Map). By Resolution No. 17-493 (September 26, 2017), the Dakota County Board of Commissioners (County Board) approved the Rich Valley Regional Greenway Master Plan, now known as the Veterans Memorial Greenway Master Plan since the greenway's 2020 renaming. The Master Plan identified the land within the existing Lakeside Park in Eagan as the preferred alignment for a segment of the Greenway trail.

Veterans Memorial Greenway, Phase II, will entail the construction of about two miles of shared-use trail, including a bridge over State Trunk Highway 3 in Eagan and Inver Grove Heights. Construction is proposed in 2025. Phase II is being funded in part by Federal and State funding.

The County Easement is legally described in Attachment: Legal Description of Regional Trail Easement, and generally depicted in Attachment: General Depiction of Regional Trail Easement, on the Eagan Property. Eagan has been a very cooperative partner in this project, is willing to donate the Easement to the County, and supports the construction of a new regional greenway trail.

A Dakota County Donation Plan (Donation Plan) has been adopted in accordance with Policy 1570 Gift Acceptance by Resolution No. 24-101 (February 27, 2024). The donation that the City of Eagan is providing for the Veterans Memorial Greenway warrants a recognition and thank-you letter signed by the Board Chair and Commissioner of the Donor's district (Attachment: Recognition Letter).

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends acceptance of the Easement from the City of Eagan for the Veterans Memorial Greenway project.

Authorization To Amend Joint Powers Agreement With Goodhue County To Board Inmates At **Goodhue County Jail**

PURPOSE/ACTION REQUESTED

Authorize the Sheriff to amend the existing joint powers agreement with Goodhue County to board inmates at the Goodhue County Jail.

SUMMARY

In September 2023, with the approval of the Dakota County Board of Commissioners, the Dakota County Sheriff's Office entered into a Joint Powers Agreement with the Goodhue County Sheriff's Office to board jail inmates at the Goodhue County Jail. The current joint powers agreement is in effect through December 31, 2026.

Due to staffing shortage, the Sheriff's Office continues boarding a portion of its population to ease the burden until staffing numbers recover. 2024 year-to-date number of Dakota County inmates boarded in Goodhue County averages 10 inmates per day at a rate of \$60 per inmate, per day, per bed, plus medical and dental costs. Goodhue County notified the Sheriff that the rate of \$60 per inmate, per day will increase to \$65 per inmate, per day beginning January 1, 2025. The joint powers agreement requires Dakota County Board approval for an annual increase above \$1 per inmate per day. The Dakota County Sheriff supports this amendment and requests the Dakota County Board of Commissioners to approve the amendment of the joint powers agreement to reflect the increase from \$60 per inmate, per day to \$65 per inmate, per day for the period of January 1, 2025, through December 31, 2025, with one, one-year optional renewal upon written agreement with the parties, subject to approval as to form by the Dakota County Attorney's Office.

The Sheriff's Office has budgeted funds to cover the boarding costs for 2025.

RECOMMENDATION

Authorize the Sheriff to amend the joint powers agreement with Goodhue County to board inmates at the Goodhue County Jail to reflect the increased rate of boarding cost per inmate, per day for the period of January 1, 2025, through December 31, 2025, with one, one-year optional renewal upon written agreement with the parties.

EXPLANATION OF FISCAL/FTE IMPACTS

The Sheriff's Office cost for inmate boarding is included in the County Manager's 2025 recommended budget.

Women, Infant, And Children Program Update

PURPOSE/ACTION REQUESTED

Receive an update on the Women, Infant, and Children (WIC) Program.

SUMMARY

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 375A.04, the Dakota County Board of Commissioners is, and performs the duties and exercises the powers of, a community health board under Minn. Stat. Ch. 145A, and is required to govern and administer those functions as fully as other Dakota County functions, including the responsibility to prevent disease and to promote and protect the public health of Dakota County residents.

Since 1978, Dakota County has managed the federally funded Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women Infants and Children (WIC). The WIC program aims to protect the health of lowincome women, infants, and children up to age 5 who are at nutritional risk. WIC goals are achieved by providing nutrition education, supporting breastfeeding, connecting participants to health and social services programs and providing nutritious foods to supplement diets. To be eligible for WIC. participants must meet categorical requirements, live in Minnesota, and meet income guidelines. Approximately 90 percent of WIC participants qualify for WIC because of receiving Medical Assistance (MA) benefits. Participants are also eligible if they meet the WIC income guidelines, which is 185 percent of the federal poverty levels per household.

The Dakota County WIC program is primarily funded by a federal grant that is passed through from the Minnesota Department of Health. Dakota County was awarded \$1,385,000 for the Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2025, which is based on a formula of \$20.00 per participant in 2024. Dakota County's WIC caseload for FFY 2024 was 69,151 participants, which is the cumulative total of all WIC participants who received food benefits each month.

Dakota County WIC serves a complex caseload with 17 percent of participants being considered "high-risk", and cultural and language diversity increasing each year. Case management of high-risk participants, such as pregnant participants who are gaining weight outside the recommendations, parents and infants experiencing lactation concerns, or children with low hemoglobin, requires the expertise of a Registered Dietitian to address these issues. Additionally, clients who are non-English speakers or are new to the country require additional time to ensure communication is clear and their unique needs are met. To accommodate the shifting of caseload complexity, WIC has carefully adjusted operations to ensure high-quality services.

The Dakota County WIC program continues to be a statewide leader in implementing innovative changes to increase efficiencies, improve client services and health outcomes. In 2021, WIC was awarded a five-year peer breastfeeding support grant that allowed Public Health to hire peer counselors who work with mothers of diverse backgrounds to increase breastfeeding initiation and duration. Peer counselors are recruited from the communities they serve and work with families during times that meet their needs. In addition, in July, Dakota County WIC was the first in Minnesota to pilot the new statewide WIC Information Next-gen for Nutrition, Integrity & Education System (WINNIE) which is a faster, web-based information system that will help increase staff efficiency and will allow for WIC to be more easily embedded into the community. Lastly, this past summer WIC received grant funding to improve the shopping experience for Limited English Proficiency (LEP) participants.

OUTCOMES

How much?

Dakota County WIC is the third largest WIC Program in Minnesota.

In 2023, the Dakota County WIC Program saw a total of 9,737 unduplicated participants. Of these, 28 percent were pregnant or postpartum individuals, 28 percent were infants and 43 percent were children under the age of 5.

How well?

WIC has positive effects on breastfeeding and birth weight.

- Since its start in 2022, the Dakota County WIC's Peer Breastfeeding program has had a positive impact on lactation. Participants who receive peer services have a higher breastfeeding rate at initiation, two weeks, two months, and three months compared to those who did not have a peer.
- Low birth weight infants are more common for women with no or little WIC prenatal participation. In 2023, for women with three or more months of Dakota County WIC prenatal participation, 8.4 percent of infants were born at a low birth weight, compared to 13.5 percent for women with no prenatal WIC participation. The average medical expenditure for low-birthweight infants averages \$114,437.

Is anyone better off?

WIC is a good investment.

- Research has shown that one dollar invested in WIC saves about \$2.48 in medical, educational, and productivity costs.
- WIC breastfeeding support and services help participants meet breastfeeding recommendations. More participants meeting breastfeeding recommendations could save \$17.2 billion in national annual medical costs and prevent 3,340 deaths annually.
- The peer breastfeeding program advances health equity by increasing initiation and duration for all race/ethnicities.
