




The Dakota County Opioid Response Advisory Committee supports the development of a comprehensive and effective countywide response to the opioid crisis. It provides recommendations to the county board on the use of Opioid Settlement Funds for external projects and initiatives.

- People who have used one or more illicit opioids and who are currently in recovery
- Individuals who use prescription opioids for chronic pain management

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### 2025 – 2026 Priorities and Actions



#### INCREASE COMMUNITY AWARENESS

Create and promote culturally appropriate and stigma reducing opioid messages to increase community awareness.

- ► Create a substance use disorder and recovery services community guide.\*
- Start a paid communication campaign to increase opioid awareness and recruit help.



#### Create and expand adolescent and adult recovery services to improve community

2025 – 2026 Priorities and Actions



Engage organizations and schools to promote adolescent opioid prevention.

- Research and report evidence-based adolescent opioid prevention efforts locally and nationally.
- Identify Dakota County organizations, diversion programs, and schools that serve prioritypopulation adolescents. Develop relationships and share information.



Distribute naloxone throughout Dakota County and educate community on how it works to reduce overdoses.

- ► Identify where naloxone is available and where overdoses are occurring. Create a distribution and training plan.
- Create a near-expiration naloxone usage plan for community and partners.

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### Recommendation and Discussion



Staff recommends adoption of the 2025-2026 strategic plan from the County Board Appointed Opioid Response Advisory Committee.

- ORAC to focus on increasing community awareness
- Public Health to recommend future funding priorities and processes
- County Board to determine future of ORAC
