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## Eligible Use of Funds

Prevention

- Prevent over-prescribing and ensure appropriate prescribing and dispensing of opioids
- Prevent misuse of opioids
- Prevent overdose deaths and other harms

Treatment

- Treat Opioid Use Disorder
- Support People in Treatment and Recovery
- Connect people who need help to the help they need
- Address the needs of criminal justice involved persons
- Address the needs of the perinatal population, caregivers and families

Other

- First Responders
- Leadership, Planning and Coordination
- Training
- Research
- Post-Mortem

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## Reporting Requirements



- Annual Reporting is required
  - Under \$25,000 report contact information and information on funded service/program
  - \$25,000 or more report contact information, information on funded service/program and outcomes for the service/program
- Dakota County is responsible to report on any funds that are dispersed to cities and to the community
- Reporting will include data on programs and services on the approved uses
- Department of Health and Human Services (DHS) will collect, collate and publicly report the data
- Data will be used to inform the public and policymakers on the use of the funds by local governments


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## Internal Administrative Committee



- Responsible for administrative oversight of the settlement, invoices, contracts, reporting, etc.
- Develop criteria to determine Advisory Taskforce membership
- Coordinate process to select Advisory Taskforce members
- Meet monthly or as needed
- Provide updates to the Advisory Taskforce

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## Opioid Advisory Taskforce

**Purpose of the Taskforce:**

- To develop and recommend a comprehensive and effective countywide response to the opioid epidemic


**Taskforce will:**

- Review request for proposals
- Provide subject matter expertise, coordinate and meet with key stakeholders
- Develop a framework for funding; monitor settlement funds and timelines
- Recommend to the County Board projects and initiatives to be funded
- Assure outcomes are being met
- Monitor Dakota County specific data

**Recommended Structure**

- Application process for all community partners
- Assure representation from all county districts and stakeholders
- Facilitated by County Staff
- Meet monthly through 2023 and provide updates to the board

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## Discussion for the Board

- 1. Approval to form an Opioid Advisory Taskforce**
  - Appointment process
  - Reporting mechanism with the County Board
- 2. Role of the Taskforce**
  - Advisory Taskforce will facilitate the request for proposal process, review and recommend applicants
  - Bring recommendation to CSCW for **Board approval**
- 3. Funding options for cities**
  - Set aside a certain percentage of Dakota County funds for cities that did not receive funding.
    - Cities will follow the same reporting requirements for all recipients

**AND/OR**

  - Cities apply through Opioid Advisory Taskforce RFP process

**AND/OR**

  - Cities apply for State Opioid funds

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
